

Proceedings had
at a meeting of
the citizens of
Millerton, on Decr.
30 & 31st, A.D. 1867,

At a called meeting of the Citizens of
Millerton, held on the 30th day of December,
1867, for the purpose of taking into consid-
eration the locating of the Chinese popula-
tion heretofore occupying the Town of
Millerton, and for the purpose of adopting
some plan or system in the re-building
of said Town, J. Scott Ashman was duly
appointed Chairman, and Wm. Faymonde,
Secretary.

The object of the meeting being studied by the
Chairman, on Motion of J. W. Shannon
it was resolved that a Committee of five be
chosen for the purposes above indicated, to wit:
to ascertain and define the limits of this
Town within which no Chinese inhabitants
shall be allowed to reside, and to submit
some plan to be adopted in the reconstruction
of this Town.

On Motion, C. A. Hart, Ira Stroud, Lewis
Leach, J. W. Shannon and Otto Froelich
were unanimously chosen as such Committee,
and instructed to report to this Meeting to-
morrow, at 7 o'clock, P. M., to which time
the meeting adjourned.

Tuesday, December 31st, 1847
Pursuant to adjournment, the Citizens of
Meridian assembled at the Courthouse at
7 o'clock, P. M.

The committee appointed yesterday, (J. C.
Denny having also acted as a member of
said Committee,) to define the limits of
this Town, and to designate a proper point
without the limits of this Town for the Chinese
population, and to recommend the establish-
ments of public roads &c., presented the
following resolutions, to wit:

Resolved, That all persons wishing to
erect Buildings for the occupation of Chi-
nese, be requested to build on the West side
of the first creek below Shannon's House.

Resolved, That a road be established taking
the fourth post on the East side of Shannon's
fence as a starting point and running from
thence to the corner below Greirsens Adobe
House, now designated by a Stake, from
thence in a direct line to Denny's Brick
store, allowing the road to be sixty feet wide;
from the starting point along the first bench
due west through the Chinese burying ground
to a point where the old road crosses the creek.

On Motion, the aforesaid resolutions were
unanimously adopted.

On Motion, the following Resolution was
also read and adopted, to wit:

Resolved, That it is the express wish and
desire of this Meeting that all Chinese
female inhabitants be requested to remove
from the limits of the Town of Millerton, to
the ground designated in Resolution No. one,
so soon as the same can be effected without
serious detriment to themselves, or to those
whose property they are at present occupying.
On Motion, the meeting adjourned.
