SETTLEMENT OF FRESNO COUNTY: MIGRATION & IMMIGRATION

There was massive migration and immigration into California between the end of the Civil War and the first decades of the twentieth century. The photographs and documents in this section highlight American westward migration from three separate groups looking for a fresh start, as well as photographs of Fresno County's most significant immigrant communities from 1880 to 1920.

George Washington Mordecai Collection, 1868-1920

Born in Henrico County, Virginia, George Washington Mordecai fought in the Civil War with Robert E. Lee and Stonewall Jackson. Mordecai came to California in July 1868 and settled in northern Fresno County with several southern families who sought a safe haven during Reconstruction. Approximately seventy colonists formed the Alabama Colony, yet most of the settlers left after a few years. However, Mordecai married into the locally-prominent Dixon family and farmed a 2,200 acre ranch called Refuge. By the 1890s, Mordecai's agricultural success and civic engagement made him a natural Democratic candidate for the California State Assembly. He was elected twice and, in January 1893, successfully introduced the bill to separate Madera County from Fresno County. Mordecai is representative of the extremely conservative Democratic trends in early Fresno County politics. *The materials in this collection were gathered for a Teaching American History project, and the originals can be found at the Madera County Historical Society and/or the California History Room of the Madera County Library*.

Charles H. Robinson Family Collection, 1828-1900

Charles H. Robinson served with the Union Army in the 47th Illinois Volunteers as a First Lieutenant before being honorably discharged on October 11, 1864. Left a widower after the war with his small daughter Carrie to care for, Robinson married Mary Lenora Ormsby in 1867. The couple relocated to Sonoma County, California around 1874, and by 1879, the family was living in Fresno County. In addition to images of the Robinson family, this collection includes the diary of Robinson's daughter Caroline (Carrie) Robinson Sage. It documents the Robinson family trip from Fresno County to Los Angeles and back up the coast and home via San Luis Obispo. The reason for the trip in the spring of 1882 was to celebrate Carrie's marriage to John Epler Sage who become a sawmill owner and mountain poet. John and Carrie Sage became known as one of the pioneering families of Selma.

Hutchinson Collection, circa 1914

This collection of images offers a unique glimpse of the rural Fresno County community of Fowler circa 1914. The photographs document the people, businesses, homes and street scenes of this farming community. Of particular note are the images showing the African American and Japanese

communities. The African American residents of Fowler migrated into the San Joaquin Valley following the Civil War and Reconstruction to escape the oppressive Jim Crow laws in the South. The demand was high for agricultural laborers, and unlike many other regions, rural Central California offered the opportunity to own land.

Immigration Photograph Collection

These images were gathered to represent the major immigrant groups that settled in Fresno County in the late-nineteenth and early-twentieth centuries. Armenian, Chinese, Danish, Japanese, Mexican, Southern European, and Volga German communities formed the foundation of Fresno's ethnic heritage. These photographs and supplementary materials outline this rich cultural legacy.
